Meeting called to order at 7pm

April Minutes were approved with no corrections.

**Treasurer's Report-** Pat Brown

As of April 30, we have \$45256.70. This is higher than usual as spring grants were not distributed. This amount includes \$12664.28 for the Reader Board.

**Principal's Report**

Prom assembly on Wed. Prom is Saturday. Finishing up ACT testing. Results arrive in about 2 months. We are losing 5 teachers and two classified next year as of current budget projection. That equals 30 sections, mostly electives. Class sizes will increase next year. There is another budget meeting next week. Track will need to be replaced in about 2 years; the cost is around \$200k.

**Old Business**

Readerboard- Approved by the Tualatin City Council. There is a 30 day waiting period for appeals. The mason has agreed to install the bricks for free; we will just need to buy the bricks. The reader board will cost \$27300 installed and we have collected \$27350.

Auction 2011- offer clubs/departments a % back on what they get donated. Clubs/departments could expect at least 40% back on what their items bring in. This could help alleviate the number of small fundraisers throughout the year. Another possibility is to hold the auction at the school next year. Although we would not be able to serve alcohol, we wouldn't have to pay for a site. Admission fee would be much lower. We could also feature student talent (art, band, choir, etc.) This would hopefully help bring the school together to work for the common good of the school. Clubs would have to provide volunteers for the committee and auction. If clubs/departments want to request fall grants, those that participate in the auction would have priority of those who did not. Kathy Stallkamp will chair.

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FBLA took top honors earlier this month earning the 6A State Chapter of the Year at the State Business Leadership Conference in Portland. TuHS qualified 14 students to move on to the National Leadership Conference in Orlando, FL this summer. Other victories for TuHS FBLA included earning 8 of the top 10 finishes in the Accounting II event at state and breaking the school record by earning more than \$1200 for the March of Dimes, the FBLA fundraising partner. TuHS has the second biggest chapter in the state and it is the largest club at the school with 127 members.
