

# TSO Meeting Notes

May 11, 2010

Preliminary Minutes Needing Approval

The meeting was brought to order at 7:00 PM.

**Secretary's Report:** The April meeting minutes were approved.

**V.P. Fundraising:** Teresa Braun reported that Tualatin High will challenge Tigard High to a Burgerville fundraising competition next fall.

**Student Report:** Laura Baker reported on behalf of Molly that Prom was successful. The 80's dance is scheduled for May 14<sup>th</sup> and is organized by the Thespians. Planning for graduation is underway.

Shawn Coleman reported that Packbackers will support the reader board provided the City of Tualatin approves the permit. A dollar amount was not stipulated. Kathy Stallkamp reported that Byrom Elementary will help with the re-zoning costs as they would like to install an electronic reader board in the future.

**New Business:** TSO will have a year-end social for TSO members to honor Jeff's retirement. A date and location will be determined by Kathy and Jeff.

Shawn Coleman suggested a fundraising opportunity to support Grad night next year. It is a Girls Night Out social with hosted tables offering dessert, a possible fashion show of gently used prom dresses and other activities to be determined. Shawn will explore the idea further.

**Finance:** Bev Colisch reported that letters went out to all staff who requested spring grants, informing them of the committee's decision regarding their request.

**Hospitality:** Lindy Hughes reported that during Teacher Appreciation week it became apparent to volunteers that the staff refrigerator was in poor condition. Consequently parents donated funds towards the purchase of a new refrigerator. A motion was made and passed to allocate up to \$400 towards the purchase of a replacement refrigerator after donations and remaining Hospitality funds have been used.

Lindy has received a request to provide cookies and/or brownies for the Senior Awards night and is considering alternatives to store bought items.

**Grad Night:** Kathy Stallkamp reported no new news.

**Site Council:** Debbie Meador reported that the all day retreat on May 10<sup>th</sup> had an extensive agenda. Significant improvements have been noted on Oaks tests in Reading and Science. Intervention is planned at all grades for individual low scores. Gang activity incidents have decreased. There was a District TAG presentation proposing different rather than more school work for TAG students. The District understands TAG programs at the Middle School Level are in most need of remediation.

Darin Barnard, incoming Principal asked that Site Council increase its parent membership to 4 members instead of 3 for next year. Consequently there is one open position.

**Activities:** Patti McCullough reported via email that 14 students qualified for Nationals in FBLA after April's State conference and convention. Four students are competing at the National Leadership and Competition Convention in July.

There were 37 elected ASB officers and 60 students ran for a position. The canned food drive raised 43,000 pounds of food. ASB was awarded the "Grand Council" award at the spring Oregon Association of Student Council leadership conference. Tualatin is one of 4 schools in the State to receive this honor.

**Athletics:** Shawn Coleman reported strong performances in all spring sports. Packbackers is planning to install a second score board. Sign-ups for summer camps are available online. The week of August 1<sup>st</sup>- 8<sup>th</sup> is camp free for vacation planning purposes.
