Announcements- Kathy Stalkamp

TTSD Foundation held raffles for schools each night of the phone-a-thon. TuHS won two raffles @ \$100each.

VP Fundraising-Marianne Germond

We earned around \$80 from Qdoba.

We discussed whether or not we should look into holding additional restaurant nights. Marianne will look into the possibility of holding a few during the summer at places like Jamba Juice and Peachwave.

Old Business- Reader Board

The application is into the City of Tualatin. There will be a planning committee meeting at the end of March and a city Council meeting in April. We are selling bricks for the base of the reader board and have made \$1500 so far. The Packbackers will contribute some money once we have a final cost and the city's approval. There was some discussion of how the Packbackers decide how much money to donate.

New Business

A new scrip coordinator is needed. Melody Stone is willing to fill in. An email was sent out looking for a volunteer. It looks like there are several willing to help out.

School District Funding/Budgeting

S3 (Sustainable schools) has put together a recommendation which is pretty ugly. We need to cut almost \$10million from the budget. Feedback from last night's public forum- many people favor cutting school days (up to 24 to make up current recommendations) over cutting teachers and programs. It is easier to add back days than programs.

**Treasurer's Report**-Pat Brown

Total assets: \$16,990.62; Total Liabilities: \$11,100.72. We have \$13070.50 in Checking,\$3283.34 in Money Market and \$636.78 in scrip account.

\$28K gross proceeds, just under \$23K net. There were 144 paying guests. The silent auction did better than usual. The paddle raise brought in \$5125 to support the 4A's. \$1500 was raised for the reader board. The general feeling was that people did not spend like they have in past years.

Robotics teams competed at the Evergreen Space Museum for the first time.

Ecology club will be partnering with local organizations to conduct a river clean-up instead of the SOLV beach clean-up. They will be offering campus bird watching walks to students and staff on Thursdays at 6:45am after Spring Break. These will run through the end of the year. They will also continue to remove non-native plants in the school wetland throughout the spring.

**Finance**-Bev Colisch

Spring Grants- do we have the funds? How does the Reader board funding effect our spring grants? We still need pledge from the Packbackers. The TSO will continue to raise funds by selling bricks. It was decided that we would not offer spring grants due to budget uncertainties, a decrease in auction proceeds and the potential of an upcoming bond measure for technology improvements.
